#### **Precautionary Statements**

#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give

artificial respiration. Get immediate medical attention.

Skin contact: Immediately flush skin with plenty of water (using soap, if available). Remove

contaminated clothing and footwear. Wash clothing before reuse. Get medical

attention.

Eye contact: Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15

minutes. Get medical attention.

**Ingestion:** DO NOT induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel.

Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get immediate

medical attention.

### 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.

Special firefighting procedures: Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing, such as

turn-out gear. Water should be used to cool closed containers to prevent pressure build-up and possible autoignition or explosion when exposed to

extreme heat.

Unusual fire or explosion hazards: Contents under pressure. Vapors may accumulate in low or confined areas,

travel considerable distance to source of ignition, and flash back. Exposure to temperatures above 49°C (120°F) may cause container to burst. Do not

puncture or incinerate pressurized containers.

#### 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Use personal protection recommended in Section 8, isolate the hazard area and deny entry to unnecessary and unprotected personnel.

Environmental precautions: Do not allow product to enter sewer or waterways.

Clean-up methods: Remove all sources of ignition. Ensure adequate ventilation. Keep

unnecessary personnel away. Wear appropriate protective equipment and clothing during clean-up. Soak up with inert absorbent material (e.g. sand, silica gel, acid binder, universal binder, sawdust). Scrape up as much material as possible. Store in a closed metal container until ready for disposal. Vapors are heavier than air and may travel along the ground or be moved by ventilation and subsequently ignited by heat, pilot lights or other ignition sources at locations distant from the material handling point. Refer to Section

8 "Exposure Controls / Personal Protection" prior to clean up.

### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling: Prevent contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Do not breathe vapor and mist.

Wash thoroughly after handling. During use and until all vapors are gone: Keep area ventilated - do not smoke; extinguish all flames, pilot lights, and heaters; turn off stoves, electrical tools and appliances, and any other sources of ignition.
